






Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act (IIJA)

- 1. Signed into law in 2021.
- 2. Also commonly known as the Bipartisan Infrastructure Law.
- 3. \$1.2 trillion in total funding.
- 4. Directed \$550 billion in new infrastructure funding.
- 5. Major areas include transportation, energy and the electric grid, water resources, and more.


Where the IIJA allocates \$550 billion in new infrastructure investment Funding (billions of dollars)

Inflation Reduction Act (IRA)


- 1) Signed into law in August 2022.
- 2) Contains \$369 billion in funding to tackle climate change.
- 3) Pursues goal of cutting GHG levels in half from 2005 levels by 2030.
- Many programs are still being formulated.




