HEA 1219 PFAS Biomonitoring pil ot program

Provides that IDHS may establish the PFAS biomonitoring pilot program to collect and analyze blood samples of 1,000 individuals who were previously, or are currently, firefighters:

(1) for serum PFAS levels; and (2) to determine whether there may be corresponding health implications associated with elevated serum PFAS levels.

Provides that the department may consult with IDEM and the IDOH.

Cancer is the leading cause of line of duty deaths among firefighters



PFAS AND YOUR HEALTH



PFAS are associated with several serious health risks. Firefighters are at risk of having elevated PFAS levels and can take action to learn more about their exposure and protect their health.



PFAS Health Effects

- Immune Suppression (USEPA) « Kidney Cancer (ATSDR)
- High Cholesterol (ATSDR)
- Testicular Cancer (ATSDR)
- Liver Effects (ATSDR)
 Hormone Disruption (USEPA)
- Impaired Fertility (USEPA)





FOAM COLLECTION PF

In 2020, the Indiana General Assembly passed House Enrolled Act 1189, prohibiting the use of firefighting foam containing PFAS for training purposes. The new collection and disposal program allows Indiana to protect Hoosier firefighters and the environment.

GOAL

Firefighters know they are exposed to PFAS at a higher rate than the general population, but they do not know their own blood PFAS levels

HEA 1219 gives members information they are currently missing about their own health
